THE NEW SINKING **FUND**

Bronson Community Schools appreciates the support shown by voters in the 2014 passing of the sinking fund. This fund has allowed the Board of Education to address areas of critical needs for our facilities over the last four years providing substantial upgrades. Our roofs, boilers, entries and phone systems are now up to date and function in ways that support an appropriate learning environment. Thank you Bronson, for showing how much our kids mean to you!!

On November 6, a new sinking fund is on the ballot to address further needs in our schools; primarily in the areas of SAFETY, SECURITY and TECHNOLOGY. This new fund will access the current, updated language from the State of Michigan that allows for projects in these areas. The GREAT NEWS is that the new fund will levy the same 2 mills as the current fund. It is NOT AN INCREASE from what is currently being collected. The ballot language will read that the sinking fund is an "increase;" however, because there are now additional projects that can be completed with sinking fund dollars.

Support for the sinking fund on November 6 will generate approximately \$2 million over 5 years (about \$400,000 annually). Potential projects include upgrades to security through redesigned entry points, bullet-proof window film, increased camera surveillance, plus added technology routers and switches to support more learning devices. The fund would also allow the board to complete some of the final "wish list" items left unfinished from the first sinking fund.

LEADER IN ME - HABITS 4, 5, & 6

SINKING FUND FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Who is voting?

Registered voters within the Bronson Community Schools District

What is being voted on?

Vote on a proposal to establish a Sinking Fund for Building Repairs, Safety, Security, and Technology

When is the vote taking place?

Tuesday, November, 6, 2018

Where do I vote?

At your regular poling place for all elections: city, township, etc. (You can visit www.Michigan.gov/Vote for this information and more)

What does the ballot language say?

The ballot reads:

"Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property in Bronson Community School District, Branch and St. Joseph Counties, Michigan, be increased by and the board of education be authorized to levy not to exceed 2 mills (\$2.00 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 5 years, 2019 to 2023, inclusive, to create a sinking fund for the construction or repair of school buildings, for school security improvements, for the acquisition or upgrading of technology and all other purposes authorized by law; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2019 is approximately \$400,000?"

Don't we already have a sinking fund? Why does the ballot say "increase" instead of "renewal"?

When the 2014 sinking fund was passed, expenses could include building repairs and safety. The State of Michigan now also allows sinking funds to cover security and technology. The Board of Education chose to expand the scope of the sinking fund to include security and technology. It is because of this the wording must say "increase" instead of "renewal." However, it is the same 2 mills as the current fund YOU WILL PAY NO INCREASE.

What are the advantages of a sinking fund?

There are many advantages to a sinking fund. Sinking funds have limited uses, are pay as you go with no interest, have a limited time to spend the money (it cannot be used as a savings account), provide funds for improvements for five years, would alleviate stress on the general fund and help us keep programs and teachers, sinking fund projects do not require prevailing wages be paid, and the school could begin projects sooner.

How will these funds be used?

If voters choose to pass the sinking fund proposal this November, the improvements listed below will be possible:

- New routers and switches in all buildings to increase student access to technology
- Add more security cameras to ALL district buildings
- Redesign to the Bronson Jr/Sr High School office suite for additional entrance security
- Add security to Anderson and Ryan Elementary entrances
- Install bullet-proof window film on internal and external glass for added safety and security
- Complete items unfinished from the current fund
